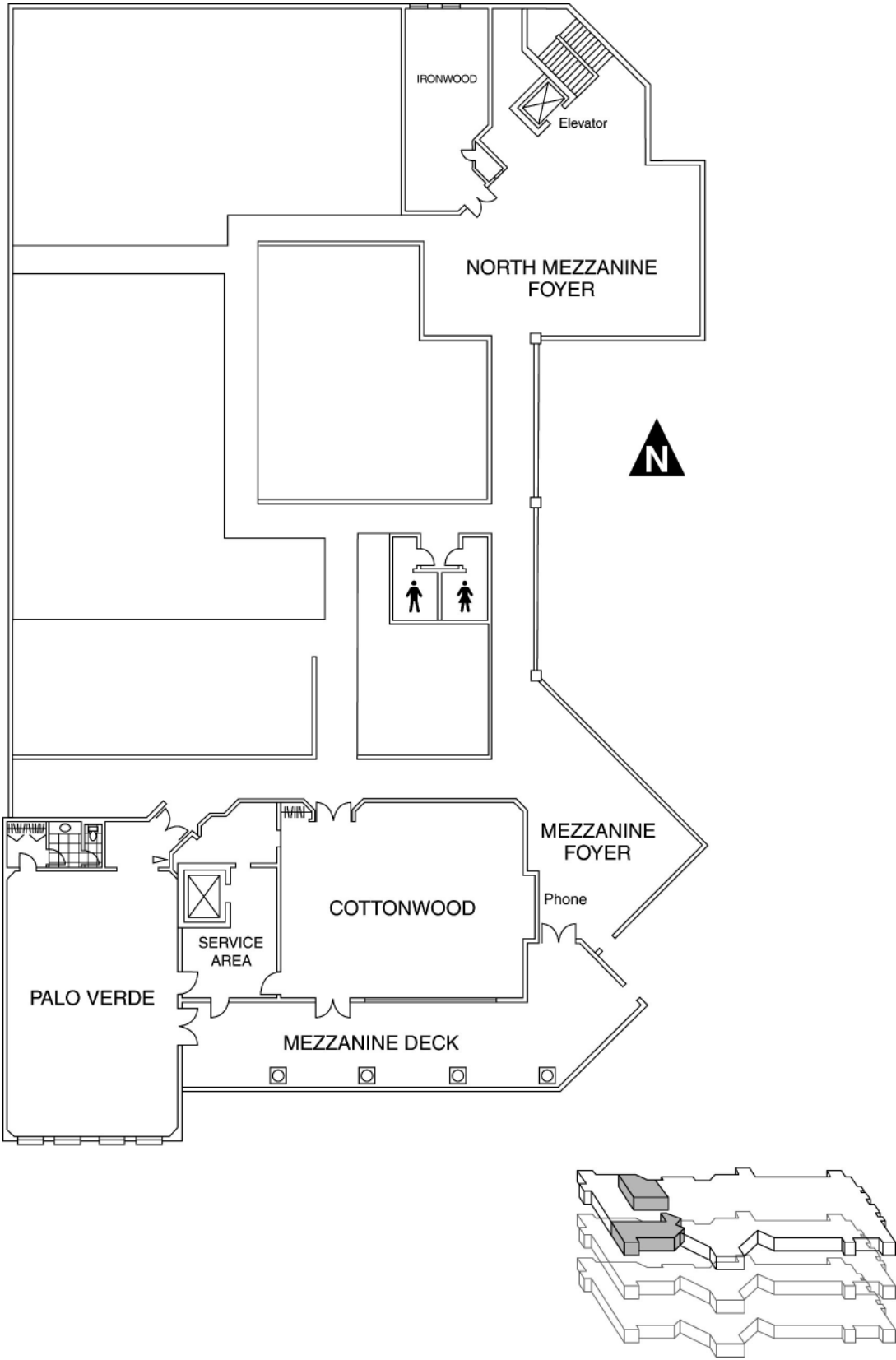

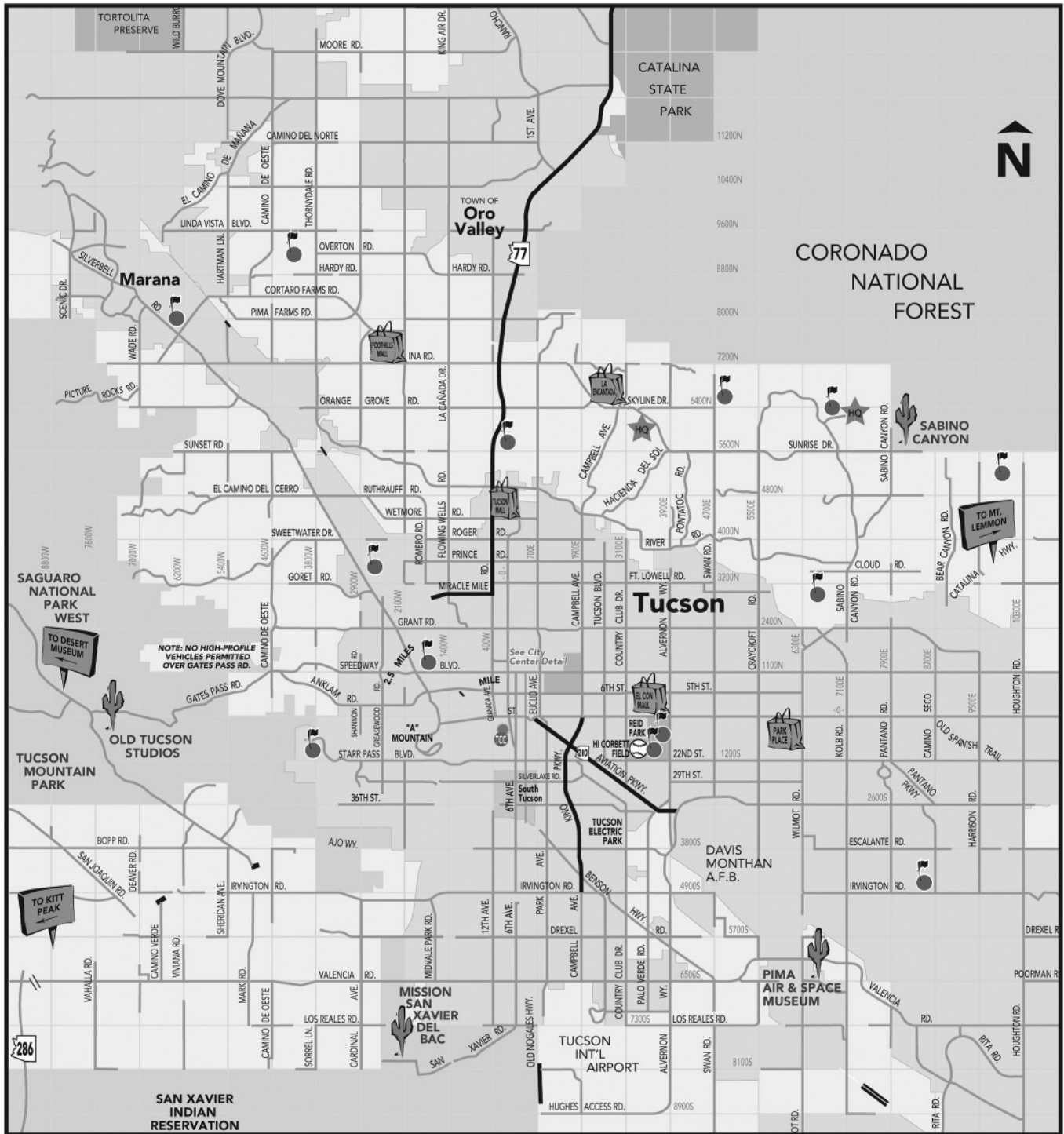
HOTEL MAP - WESTIN - MAIN LEVEL
