

## What is the Premier Series?

The Premier Series is an array of courses designed to provide teachers with the skills they need to be successful as an instructor in CTE Programs. The Premier Series is a Professional Development Series partnered with the Arizona Department of Education - Career and Technical Education Division, to meet the requirements for a Standard CTE Teaching Certificate by providing convenient, relevant, and affordable professional knowledge coursework.


The Premier Series offers courses to CTE teachers who want to improve their teaching, as well as to industry professionals who are experts in their field and want to become expert **teachers** of their field. There are more than 20 courses in the Premier Series.

Premier Series classes enable a teacher to remove deficiencies from a Standard CTE Teaching Certificate. Upon completion of each course, the participant will earn one (1) semester hour (SH) of the required professional knowledge coursework and receive a certificate.

#### **Teachers Who Need to Remove Deficiencies**

If your certificate was issued with deficiencies, you may need to complete up to 15 semester hours (SH) of Premier Series courses within three years of the valid date on your teaching certificate\*. For example, if a certificate's valid date is March 3, 2020, then up to 15 semester hours (SH) of Premier Series courses must be completed before March 3, 2023, for the teaching certificate to remain valid. #### I'm already a certified teacher but want to teach CTE. What Premier Series courses should I take?

Certified high school teachers wishing to become CTE educators are required to take three (3) semester hours of coursework as a pre-requisite to becoming CTE certified.
