# **Poster Requirements**

- Size: 18" (W) x 24" (H)
- · Must include:
  - The official CTE Month® logo
  - The official eCTE logo
  - The official Arizona CTE logo (Download all three logos on the website here: <a href="https://www.acteaz.org/events/cte">https://www.acteaz.org/events/cte</a> month/poster-contest/)
  - · Title: "Arizona CTE Works"
  - Credits: "Statistics from acteonline.org and careertech.org"
  - (5) Arizona CTE statistics (choose from the list provided below)
  - · No additional web addresses or logos
- All artwork must be original:
  - Includes vector graphics, photography, illustrations, etc.
  - · Al-generated artwork is not accepted.
- Anyone featured in the poster must have a signed release form on file. Students under the age of 18 must have a parent's or guardian's signature on the release form. All forms must be submitted for the poster to be accepted. If forms are not submitted, the entry will be disqualified.

# **Choose (5) Arizona CTE Statistics:**

- 96% graduation rate for Arizona CTE concentrators that's 27% higher than non-CTE students
- CTE students are more likely to have a post-high school plan
- 8 years post-graduation, CTE concentrators earn more than non-CTE peers
- 36% of Arizona jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031.
  Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Arizona industries such as:
  - Manufacturing
  - · Bioscience and health care
  - · Business and financial services
  - · Film and digital media.
- 67,070+ Associates Degrees & Certificates Awarded
- 37.8% of All Degrees & Certificates Awarded Statewide
- CTE concentrators are more engaged in school they report higher levels of motivation, belonging, and real-world relevance in their coursework.
- CTE students are 42% less likely to drop out of high school compared to their peers.
- 77% of Arizona CTE concentrators go on to postsecondary education, advanced training, military service, or employment within one year of graduation.
- CTE builds employability skills 93% of Arizona employers cite communication, teamwork, and problem-solving as essential workforce skills developed through CTE.
- Arizona's CTE programs align with 79% of the state's "high-demand" careers, ensuring graduates are prepared for immediate workforce needs.
- Every \$1 invested in CTE generates a strong return through higher lifetime earnings, reduced unemployment, and strengthened state economic growth.
- Work-based learning opportunities are central to CTE thousands of Arizona students participate in internships, clinical rotations, apprenticeships, and industry mentorships each year.
- CTE programs integrate industry-recognized credentials giving students a competitive edge in fields like healthcare, IT, and advanced manufacturing.
- CTE concentrators are more likely to graduate college on time because of the dual credit and articulated pathways built into their high school programs.
